In keeping with this tradition, the **Alpha Gamma Chapter of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Inc.**, is pleased to announce that it will award a first place \$1000 scholarship and second place \$500 scholarship to qualifying graduating high school seniors pursuing a post-secondary education.

Eligibility

Graduating High School Seniors attending public, parochial, and private schools in the Greater Atlanta Area areas are eligible.

Requirements

Applicants must meet the following minimum requirements:

- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Accepted to an accredited business college, college/university, or vocational school
- Demonstrate commitment and motivation to achieving academic success
- If chosen as the recipient of the scholarship award, he/she must attend 3 Alpha Gamma Chapter events (virtual or in-person) related to youth, the betterment of the community, and/or professional development by May 2023

How Do I Apply

Complete the following:

- Scholarship Applicant General Information Form
- A brief letter of intent (typed) telling us what your academic and professional goals are and how the scholarship will assist you in achieving your goals
- Current official high school transcript
- One recommendation letter from either a teacher, school counselor, or school administrator
- One recommendation letter from either a relative (other than parent), friend, employer, or clergy



- A copy of your college acceptance letter
- A 500-word minimum essay (typed) answering the following question:
Having childhood dreams and life goals can determine what your future will hold. When we are children, we dream of being a firefighter, ballet dancer, baseball player, or even a rockstar. As we get older, we are sometimes told our dreams are unrealistic and that we should think more practical. Share with us a dream you would like to accomplish. At this point in life, what would you tell your 5-year-old self?
